#### Curriculum


##### **Acorn class**

Acorns have continued to learn about the lifecycle of a frog and the Year 1s have been writing sentences explaining what happens in this process.  The Year 1s have also been learning how to multiply using equal groups. Reception have been learning to take away using songs and have been starting to write out number sentences.


##### **Sycamore class**

Sycamores have been looking at a non-fiction text about Henry VIII this week. They have been learning new words like 'monarch, kingdom, empire and reigns'. They have also begun to learn about The Great Fire of London in History- this is one of my favourite topics! 

##### **Maple class**

I popped down to the Eco classroom to see Maple class mummifying fruit as part of their History topic on the Egyptians.  They were learning all the technical vocabulary and could explain the whole process very clearly.

##### **Beech class**


This week in English, the class have focussed on their recount of a shark attack using their class text.  In Maths, they have been learning about fractions and Finlay explained clearly to me how to work out an equivalent fraction using his knowledge of times tables- great work! They have had the great privilege of attending the modern foreign language festival at Chipping Norton school- please see their recount below.

The class are continuing to focus on Volcanoes this week and are writing a set of instructions in English about how to survive a volcano. 

In Maths, they have been learning about decimals and how to add them using their knowledge of place value.
